COURSE GOALS:

LATIN IS ONE OF THE BASIC LANGUAGES TO LEARN FOR BETTER COMMAND OF ENGLISH; OVER 65% OF THE ENGLISH VOCABULARY IS BASED ON LATIN. LATIN F506 WILL ACQUAINT YOU WITH THE PRINCIPAL FORMS AND STRUCTURES OF LATIN IN AN INTERESTING AND CHALLENGING MANNER. THE AIM IS TO BETTER UNDERSTAND LATIN MORPHOLOGY AND TO MASTER THE ESSENTIALS OF LATIN SYNTAX SO THAT YOU WILL BE ABLE TO APPLY THIS KNOWLEDGE TO TRANSLATING LATIN INTO ENGLISH CORRECTLY.

THERE WILL BE DAILY ASSIGNMENTS FROM THE TEXT, CHAPTERS 1-25. PASSAGES FROM 38 LATIN STORIES WILL COMPLEMENT THE CHAPTERS IN WHEELLOCK.

EXAMINATIONS:

EXAMS WILL CONSIST OF 3 SECTIONS: MORPHOLOGY (35%), A SEEN PASSAGE WITH IDS (45%), AND A SIGHT PASSAGE (25%).

PARTICIPATION POLICY:

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND CLASS ON A DAILY BASIS. HOWEVER, 3 UNEXCUSED ABSENCES ARE ALLOWED WITHOUT CONSEQUENCES. MORE THAN 3 UNEXCUSED ABSENCES WILL RESULT IN 5 PERCENTAGE POINTS SUBTRACTED FROM ONE'S PARTICIPATION GRADE. (I.E., 4 ABSENCES = 95%, 5 ABSENCES = 90%, ETC.).
